


HOW TO PRACTICE THE STATE TESTING AT HOME

The California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress (CAASPP) are computer adaptive assessments that are customized for each student and monitor how they are doing at school. At GIS, CAASPP is starting next week, April 15, 2024. If you would like your child to practice for this test please follow the steps below.

- 2. Select the **Student Interface Practice and Training Tests** option.
- 3. Select the **Sign In** button.
- 4. Select a grade level from the **Grade** drop-down menu.
- 5. Select the button for the practice test to be administered during this session.
- 6. Review and select test settings as needed.
- 7. Practice tests provide experience with grade-level content and accessibility resources.
- 8. Select the **Select** button.
- 9. You may be presented with the Sound and Video Playback Check. To play the sample sound and video, select the Play Video button. Select the I could play the video and sound or the I could not play the video or sound button.
- 10. Select the **Begin Test Now** button.
- 11. Start answering test questions.


