# STATE TESTING: APRIL 15th - 26th 3rd - 8th GRADES

The CAASPP, or California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress, is a standardized test for 3rd through 8th and 11th grade students in California take each year to assess their understanding in English and Mathematics. Students' Science knowledge is assessed in 5th, 8th, and once in high school. The CAASPP provides valuable information to educators and parents about students' academic strengths and areas where they may need extra support. The results help shape educational programs and policies to ensure that students receive a high-quality education that prepares them for their future endeavors, whether it's college, a career, or other life goals.

At GIS, CAASPP testing will take place April 15th through the 25th. To prepare for it, families can encourage students to review material covered in class, practice test-taking strategies, and ensure they get enough rest and nutrition on the test days. Additionally, staying informed about the test format and providing a supportive environment can help alleviate test anxiety. Attendance is crucial during State Testing window, and we're asking parents to do not schedule any appointments. Please mark these dates on your calendars and make sure that your children won't be late to school.





As a parent, you are your child's first teacher, providing guidance and encouragement through all the stages of development from the first day of school to graduating from high school, secondary education and entering the workforce. There are many ways parents can support their students throughout the school year. Below are a few ways to support your child.

### Tips for growth and success:

- Model and talk to your child about the importance of being on time and ready to learn each and every day.
- Show an interest in your child's learning. <u>Tell</u> your child your expectations when it comes to school work and encourage them to never give up!
- <u>Establish</u> regular times for family members to eat, sleep, play, work and study. Have schoolwork, especially reading, come before sports, TV, and chores.
- Encourage reading daily. <u>Visit</u> the local library online so your child can pick out a book they are interested in.
- <u>Know</u> your child's strengths and encourage them through their struggles.
- Express confidence in your child's ability to be successful. Talk with your child about their future.
- Ask them about their day. If they say "I don't know" ask specific questions like:
